- 15 new hires so far in 2021

Campus Services

- 24/7 police and investigative services for campus
- Emergency Management Unit -- helps to prepare for campus response to emergencies and disasters
- Access Control and Infrastructure Security -making sure our campus buildings are secured with the latest technology and standards
- Fingerprinting services for students and staff
- WiscAlerts -- emergency alerts that allow us to reach the entire campus via email, text, social media, etc. in a matter of seconds
- UWPD Lake Rescue & Safety -- providing rescue and safety services to boaters and swimmers on Lake Mendota
- Threat Intervention Team -- assesses and coordinates a response to threatening situations at **UW-Madison**



Our Work

- On average, we take 163 phone calls each day
- As of Dec. 1, 2020 our dispatchers managed more than 57,000 incoming and outgoing calls
- 109 cases referred to the Dane Co. District Attorney
- Referred 100 cases to The Dane Co. Community Restorative Court program
- Responded to 542 open records requests
 48 awards presented to UWPD employees and community members in 2021




System Services

- Emergency Management consulting services to our UW System schools
- Upham Woods -- provide marine patrols on the Wisconsin River at Upham Woods, protecting the facility and its visitors
- Provide police mutual aid and consultation to all UW System police departments, when requested
- Threat consultation services to all System schools



WiscAlerts

- UWPD sent a total of 16 WiscAlert messages to campus in 2021, in response to 5 unique incidents
- More than 50,000 phone numbers are opted-in to receive text WiscAlerts. Not sure if you are? Just head to go.wisc.edu/wiscalerts to check!
- WiscAlert texts are sent at speeds upwards of 2,000 messages per second.



How We Talk

- Everything is 10-2 = I'm ok, or the scene is secure
- Can you give me a 10-21? = can you give me a call?
- 10-55 = intoxicated driver
- I have one 10-95 = I have one person in custody
- I'm 10-8 = I'm back in service and ready for calls
- 10-4 = Copy that, or I understand
- 10-10, please send backup = fight in progress, send more officers please
- 10-54 outside the Stock Pavilion = there are livestock on the road outside the Stock Pavilion!

Our Training

- As of October 2021, UWPD employees have completed more than 4,000 hours of training this year.
- In addition to our annual training topics, like ethics, active threat response, and unified tactics, we put a special focus on four key areas in 2021:

- Racial Equality, Diversity, & Implicit Bias

- De-escalation, continue to provide initial and ongoing training on ICAT, and continue Professional Communication Skills training.
- Continue to expand interwoven tactical, wellness, self-care/self-awareness, and mental health training.
- Develop ideas and ways to integrate community members into department trainings.

Lake Rescue & Safety

- In the 2020 season, UWPD Lake Rescue & Safety went on a total of 587 runs (a run is a request for some sort of assistance or training on the water):
 - 42 rescue runs
 - 6 assist runs
- Assisted a total of 124 people on Lake Mendota in the 2021 boating/swimming season
- LRAS staff completed more than 656 hours of training in 2021
